Community House Renovation Update



Commonwealth Restorations will be restoring the ceiling back to its original height with bead board composition rather than the current particle board.

In addition to adding three new chandeliers with light shades, there will be two ceiling fans installed for improved ventilation.

To increase lighting, we are adding light sconces on the side walls between the windows. See drawing below. Farewell to Vel Spalding

Vel Spalding, age 58, passed away on November 10th from a long battle with cancer. Vel actually grew up near Randolph Elementary but spent a lot of time visiting relatives at 4639 4th St. S.

The house was built in 1934, one of the oldest of Barcroft's original homes. The first owner was Velma "Nannie" Hudson. Nannie's nephew, Russell Spalding and his wife Libby lived over near Randolph school They had five kids who loved to come over to Nannie's house to play. Vel was the oldest of the kids. Her siblings are Darlene, Barbara, Russ and Muriel.

The kids loved to play in the stream that ran alongside the house next door (4633 4th St. S). At that time the stream was called "Barcroft Creek" and used to flood frequently. The stream had lots of tadpoles to chase and frogs and fish to try to catch. It wasn't deep enough to swim but plenty of fun for wading.

Nannie had a little fort in the backyard with a steering wheel like a boat. The big lot next door is still undeveloped to this day. The kids loved to play games there. In the summer, the lot was full of lightening bugs that were fun to catch and put into mason jars until parents made the kids release them.

That block of 4th St. S has a small hill and the kids all liked to use it for sledding.

Nannie had an apple tree out back, so the family always enjoyed eating those fresh apples. But one day, when Nannie was well into her 70s, the kids came over for a visit and found her back there chopping down that tree with an ax!

The kids also enjoyed trips down to Barcroft Park, along Four Mile Run. There was a fun playground there. Even more exciting were the railroad tracks. It was especially exciting when a freight train went by!

When Nannie died, she left the house to Vel's parents, Russell and Libby. When Russell and Libby passed away, Vel's sister Darlene purchased the house in 2005. Darlene still resides there with her son Matthew, age 23 who also grew up spending a lot of time at that house and playing in that great yard!

Even before their mom passed away, Vel was already like a second mom to everyone in their family. She was the go-to person who just knew everything and if she didn't know, she found out and got back to whoever was asking. She had strong faith in God and an amazing gift for offering comfort to others. She was much loved by all who knew her.

So, while Vel wasn't technically a Barcrofter, she spent many wonderful hours throughout her life in the neighborhood. Barcroft Creek is now tamed, controlled and mostly underground so it can flood now only very rarely but Nannie Hudson's relatives still enjoy her home and all have a great appreciation for Barcroft neighborhood.

Neighbors often wonder if the empty lot next to the house will ever be sold. The family is in no hurry to sell it and they do enjoy leaving it undeveloped. 



Real Estate Market Update

In the "close in" Northern Virginia & DC market that I work we have actually seen an increase in sales activity in November and early December. Traffic from potential home buyers was up slightly in November, but still at low levels which is typical for this time of year. Interest rates have been averaging between 4% to 4.375% with no points for conforming conventional mortgages which is attractive to potential home buyers and home owners looking to refinance.

In Northern Virginia market, active listings are down by about 12% from last year, with 4,553 active listings in October, compared with 5,185 homes available in October 2010. The average days on market (DOM) for homes in October 2011 was up by about 8% to 65 days, compared with 60 days in October 2010. It is interesting to

See some homes selling within 30 days for certain neighborhoods and price points. The main driver of the lower housing inventory is that sellers take their homes off the market ahead of the holidays and until the New Year. Inventory levels should rise in in the first quarter of 2012 when these homes come back to market. The Spring housing market actually starts in late January and early February.
