

Arlington Mill Drive is now closed for the duration of this construction project. The jersey barriers have been relocated to Columbia Pike and S. Dinwiddie Street. Crews are installing sewer, water and other infrastructure on Columbia Pike. S. Dinwiddie Street and Arlington Mill Drive. Work is underway to excavate for the garage.

All piles required for the building and garage have been installed and the asphalt and concrete from the old parking lot has been removed.

In January and February, the following events will take place:

- A new traffic light will be placed at the intersection of S. Dinwiddie Street and Columbia Pike
- Two tower cranes will be erected at the site
- Work will begin on the garage foundation and walls







Do your kids play outside enough?

Time to Build and Play

In recent years the term "nature-deficit disorder" (coined by Richard Louv in his book *Last Child in the Woods*) has become common in today's youth. A recent study by the Kaiser Family Foundation found that kids over age 8 spend over 7 hours a day in front of a screen (computer, TV, smart-phone, etc)! To counter this, movements like No Child Left Inside and Children and Nature Networks have been started.

Recently Long Branch Nature Center and Friends of Arlington Parks have received a Park Enhancement Grant from Arlington County for a total of \$11,539 to put in a Nature Discovery Area! We've always loved being outside and taking you with us; fishing, birding, hiking, camping, and more. We now are taking steps to offer you more chances to be outside.

Right now there are no natural playdiscovery areas in Arlington County Parks, so this will be the first. Our area will have no "play equipment" - the only furnishings will be natural materials, rocks, wood, water, and a child's imagination. The space is there for kids to explore, create, climb, and play in natural setting without worry about harmful plants or animals or getting lost. We are very excited about this project and look forward to your support. The site is located below the Nature Center, steps from the stream crossing, with access from the paved trail and hiking trails. Some work has already begun in the space, with old trees being cut and cleared making way for further clean-up and new features being added.

We'd love for you to be a part in creating Arlington's first natural play area! We need some helping hands. We'll need volunteers to remove unwanted plants, put play features in place, come up with a great name, spread the word, maybe start a blog, and maintain the Nature Discovery Area once completed. As you can see, there is much yet to be done. Happy New Year! 2011 was another good year for real estate in the Metro DC area and Arlington was one of the better markets. In Barcroft there were 20 homes that sold and settled (per MRIS) with an average list price of \$568,000 and an average sold price of \$556,150 averaging 36 days on the market. Seller subsidies averaged \$3,000, with a high of \$14,000.

Mortgage interest rates have remained low. As of 1/14/12 the fixed rate for conventional loans is at 3.875% for Conforming loans up to \$417,000, 4% for Conforming Plus loans up to \$625,500 and 4.625% for Jumbo loans. FHA loans are at 3.875%, loan limit of \$729,750. VA loans up to \$625,500 are at 3.875%.

A new sales contract for the Metro DC area is in effect as of 1/1/12. On major change is that the seller now has no obligation to

repair mechanical, electrical, plumbing and appliance defects. The purchaser must request every item that is required to be repaired after having a home inspection.
