Farewell to two longtime Barcrofters, **Dave Peacefull** and **Sharon Sundial** who recently moved away to Pennsylvania.

Sharon is originally from Ohio and Dave is from Connecticut, but they met in Cleveland. When Dave took a job with the Department of Defense, they moved to Arlington. Sharon worked as a social worker for Arlington County. In 1987 they purchased their home at 201 S. Pershing Drive.

Dave and Sharon didn't always have such unusual last names. Sharon, formerly Sharon Zundel, had an attorney help her to change her name to Sharon Sundial. Dave, formerly Dave Voorhees, simply went to the Arlington Court House, paid \$39 and was able to change his name to Dave Peacefull.

Active with the BSCL, Dave and Sharon have always enjoyed attending Barcroft events, especially the 4th of July parade. Dave served as BSCL treasurer and Program Chair. Most recently, he took over the job of posting the BSCL meeting and voting reminder signs around the neighborhood after **Jack Turner** passed away.

Dave and Sharon were involved in the Neighborhood Conservation Plan. This process involved many months of surveying neighbors regarding their desires and opinions about streets, sidewalks, street lights, traffic, speed bumps, traffic circles, stop signs, services, zoning, etc. (Visit www.bscl.org for more details about it.) As part of the process, some neighbors wanted to complete the sidewalk along S. Pershing, including in front of Dave

and Sharon's home. Dave just loves his big, healthy forsythia bushes and was very concerned that putting in the sidewalk would destroy them. But then he got out his tape measure and determined that the forsythias would be unharmed. Indeed, as of the writing of this article, they are just fine and in full bloom!

Another result of the Neighborhood Conservation Plan was the placing of speed humps throughout the neighborhood including one directly in front of Dave and Sharon's home. They found that the hump really did slow down the speeders along Pershing Drive.

Dave always enjoyed helping **Randy Swart** and other neighbors in removing invasive plants along Four Mile Run. (That is an ongoing task! See article from **Mark Wigfield** in this issue.)

Another aspect of the Neighborhood Conservation Plan was to protect our Barcroft Community House. Dave and Sharon appreciate that neighbors are so carefully maintaining, caring for, using and enjoying that unique building.

Active with the Arlington Unitarian Universalist Church, Dave and Sharon enjoyed being able to walk to church, as well as to so many nearby parks. Dave was also frequently seen on his bicycle wearing bright orange safety clothing.

Now residents of Pennsylvania, Dave and Sharon are enjoying life in Kendal/Crosslands, a retirement community near Longwood Gardens. The community has lots of events and they have already made many new friends.

Barcrofters Volunteer at Arlington House

I became a Park Service VIP (Volunteer in Parks), last summer after responding to a notice in the Sun Gazette. I've told stories about the Custis and Lee families to people from around the world and almost every state. I've seen how excited 4th graders are to learn that the piece of crockery in their hand is from a set that belonged to George Washington ("I'll never wash this hand again!").

Three other Barcroft neighbors are also Arlington House volunteers. Ask **Amy Delery, Jim Perlmutter, Alice Eichers**, or me about our VIP experiences . We'd love to have you join us.

Do you knit, do hand sewing, quilt, or enjoy working with student groups? The National Park Service is expanding its visitor services at Arlington House and seeks vol-

unteers to dress in period clothing, demonstrate skills, and give students memorable experiences at the House that gave Arlington County its name. Over 500,000 guests visit Arlington House each year, learning the unique history of the house and the Custis and Lee families that called it home.

Most visitors only walk through the house; the Park Service would like to attract visitors to the former slave quarters by having workers in period dress demonstrate spinning, weaving, sewing, food preparation, and other skills. One current volunteer used to work at Mount Vernon, and is an expert spinner and weaver. Another knits while he talks to visitors.

A Bit Of Arlington History

151 years ago this month here's what was happening at Lee Mansion—

The house blazed with lights Friday night, April 19, 1861, and was filled with relations and friends anxiously discussing the recent events. Finding it impossible to think about his problem amid the excitement, Colonel Lee went outside and paced back and forth under the trees while he pondered his future course. Still undecided, he returned to the house and went up to his bedroom. Downstairs, Mrs. Lee and the others waited anxiously. Overhead, they could hear Lee's footsteps as he paced the floor, stopping only when he knelt to pray.

It was after midnight when he finally arrived at a decision and sat down to write his resignation from the United States Army. That done, he came down with it in his hand to where his wife was waiting. "Well, Mary," he said quietly, "the question is settled. Here is my letter of resignation, and a letter I have written to General Scott."

DC-Area Housing Market Ranks Among Nation's Strongest

Metropolitan Regional Information Systems (MRIS) data <u>shows</u> the DC-area housing market improved over last year:

- *Inventory is down more than 25% (currently representing a three-month supply—the lowest in seven years) *Purchase contracts are up
- 4.6% *Foreclosures are down 67.2%
- *Average price is up 1.4% overall
- *Arlington experienced an average price jump of 17.2% compared to January 2011
- * First-time buyers made up 33% of the market in January of 2012, up from 29 percent in January of 2011, according to a recent NAR report. The number of investors remained unchanged at 23%.
- *A market forecast by real estate statistical analyst Veros <u>suggests</u> that the DC market will grow at 2.9% in 2012, placing DC at #3 in its "Projected 5 Strongest Markets."
