Learn About Urban Agriculture Best Practices

Join Arlington Friends of Urban Agriculture at Barley Mac in Rosslyn on Thursday, October 3 from 5:30 to 8 p.m. for food and refreshments, and to learn how to accelerate urban agriculture initiatives in Arlington.

Special guest speaker Wythe Marschall, a national expert in vertical and indoor farming, will lead a discussion on how we can transplant best practices from New York City and European cities to grow a sustainable, just and secure food system in Arlington. Many people believe that cities, not nations, must lead the way in greening the built

world. Wythe will talk about how different public and private institutions



can intervene to build a resilient future that includes producing food in an urban setting. This is a timely discussion for Arlingtonians given Amazon's imminent social and physical transformation of Crystal City, the region's commercial and mixed-residential building boom, and the County's renewed commitment to environmental stewardship.

County Board Member Erik Gutshall will present the annual Arlington proclamation on urban agriculture while guests enjoy a locally-sourced, bespoke drink and food menu (for purchase) curated by Barley Mac's Executive Chefs Mike Cordero and Jeremy Magnanelli.

proaching completion of the Centro Arlington mixed-use commercial and residential development at the southeast corner of our neighborhood: Columbia Pike and South George Mason Drive. This development will not only bring new residents to our neighborhood with its 360 apartments, but additional conveniences: Harris Teeter, Orangetheory Fitness and a WhyHotel – and perhaps a dentist or optician. The Harris Teeter is scheduled to open in October in place of the former Food Star; it will fill something of a gap created by the recent closure of the Safeway at Bailey's Crossroads and ahead of the pending temporary closure of the Harris Teeter near Ballston.

AutumnFest at Glencarlyn Library Garden

One of the secrets known to good gardeners is how great a time Fall is for planting, especially trees and shrubs. AutumnFest at Glencarlyn Library Community Garden on Sunday, September 15 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. will provide garden lovers with a myriad of plants that will thrive in the Fall garden, as well as provide three educational opportunities and nature-related products.

Located at 300 South Kensington
Street in Arlington, this Master Gardener
demonstration garden will once again host an
autumnal family celebration, including free
herbal treats to taste, face painting, and herbal sachets to make and take home. A naturalist will be on hand with a critter, Tree Stewards, Master Gardeners and Audubon at
Home will all be there to answer questions
and provide helpful information.

AutumnFest also offers a chance to visit the oldest house in Arlington, the Ball-Sellers House, a farm home from the 1740s with a wonderful garden. Visitors to the Ball-Sellers home can create an herbal craft project and enjoy a tasty colonial treat.

Master Gardeners will provide helpful talks. The 11 a.m. talk is "Grow Your Own Herbal Tea," at which participants can taste samples and take home recipes; the 12 noon talk is "Succulents for Small Spaces" providing guidance on making the most of this hot trend; and the 1 p.m. talk is "Container Gar-

dening Made Easy" providing guidance on creating beauty and growing food in pots.

Local vendors will be available providing native plants (Hill House Nursery), and pumpkins, blooming plants and herbs (Country Gardens). Other choices include handcrafted jewelry, T-shirts with artwork featuring butterflies and their host plants, recycled reusable bags, and artistic plant pots. 

July 2019 Regional Home Sales in Northern VA compared to July 2018. A total of 2,232 homes sold in July 2019, an increase of 0.90% above July 2018 home sales of 2,213.

Active listings decreased last month compared with 2018. Listings were down by about 31% below last year, with 2,630 active listings in July, compared with 3,837 homes available in July 2018. The average DOM for homes in July was 32 days, a decrease of 34.69% compared to the 49 DOM for homes in July 2018. The average home sale price rose by 1.58% compared with last July, to \$619,082. The July 2018 average price was \$609,460.

It is still a sellers' market in most areas, particularly those inside the beltway. Low interest rates continue to drive the demand for housing – with a realization that a buyer needs to be prepared and act quickly if a home shows well and is well priced.

Arlington County and Alexandria both showed a year-over-year decrease in the total number of units sold, at -9.52% &17.03% respectively.

In July 2019, the average price of a property Arlington County (including condos, townhouses and single family) was \$684,000, up 4% from last July.

Barcroft sales this year (which include the townhouse communities), have seen an uptick compared to last year. 22 units have sold and settled in 2019 through July compared to 20 units in 2018 during the same period. The average closed price so far this year in Barcroft is \$811,443 compared to \$668,785 in 2018, which is a significant increase.
