## Barcroft Chat List Moves to Groups.io

On Monday, Dec. 2, 2019, Barcroft moved its 19-year-old chat list, bsclchat, from Yahoogroups to Groups.io. The move was precipitated by Yahoo's announcement that it would no longer support many aspects of the listserv. For Barcroft, the deal-breaker was the new "no attachments" rule, since we like to post photos of parades, curb couches, and more. Happily, the move to Groups.io went smoothly. I and everyone else I've talked to likes the new service, and bsclchat didn't miss a beat. To subscribe, send an email to: [subscribe@bsclchat.groups.io](mailto:subscribe@bsclchat.groups.io).

Please know that the new group offers some features that are useful for managing your mail or your discussion topic. Some are the same as on Yahoo, but actually

work. Many of these features can only be activated or used from the web interface: <https://bsclchat.groups.io>. It's much better and easier to use than the Yahoogroups erstwhile web interface. Log in using the e-mail address you use for groups.io, create a password, and you're in. Here are some highlights -- and more information is available by clicking "help" at the top right-hand side of the [bsclchat.groups.io](https://bsclchat.groups.io) page:

- **Digests:** you can consolidate e-mail into three varieties of digests. Or choose to get no-email at all and read messages on the web. You must make these changes from the web.
- You can also choose e-mail option "special notices only" which would be reserved for

official notices by the BSCL. Warning: this probably won't be used much, but you can still read everything on the web.

- **Hashtags:** You can assign a topic a hashtag using the #symbol: #crime, #curbalert, #howtousegroupsio, etc. You can do this in the subject line of an e-mail, but the web has all the existing hashtags for you to choose. You can also create new ones there. Hashtags can be used for searches and to lump similar topics together. Please use them!
- **Topics:** If the latest chat e-mail is about groceries, and you want to write about traffic, click on "new topic" at the bottom of the e-mail to start a new chain. Please do this! Topics are also searchable and have other functions, such as:
- **Muting:** you can leave conversations by clicking on "mute topic" at the bottom of the e-mail. You can also mute hashtags.
- **Reply all, reply to sender:** please reply only to sender if your reply is only relevant to the sender, not the entire group (like the logistics of picking up a curb couch). The reply options are available in a hyperlink at the bottom of the e-mail, or on the web by clicking "private" at the right-hand side of the message reply window. If you get the group through Out-

look, using "reply" in Outlook will still reply to the whole group. "Reply all" is the default setting of our group.

- **Polls, calendars, databases:** these are all available. I have put the BSCL meeting calendar up. Will we use these other functions? Time will tell.

Once again, to subscribe, send an email to: [subscribe@bsclchat.groups.io](mailto:subscribe@bsclchat.groups.io). You must be a Barcroft resident! I will be at the January 2 meeting to talk about the new group. I will try to answer questions, but I'm learning just like you are.... •

about this change and come to the January 2 monthly BSCL meeting where he will be making a presentation on Groups.io that you may find helpful as you make the transition yourself.

Just in case you missed it Metro released its preliminary concepts from the Blue/Orange/Silver Capacity and Reliability Study (known as the "BOS Study") on December 5. Among the concepts being advanced under the heading of a new Metro Silver Line connection south of I-66 is a new heavy rail extension between the existing Pentagon and West

Falls Church stations that would follow Columbia Pike. While this Metro planning effort is far from its conclusion this and other concepts under consideration have an array of implications for Barcroft's residents. I'd encourage anyone interested in the Metro planning process and opportunities to provide input into the BOS Study to check out <https://www.wmata.com/initiatives/plans/BOS-Study.cfm#BOS> at their earliest convenience.

Among other issues BSCL is working on are those concerning parking and the County's Residential Permit Parking program,

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Here are some predictions for the US housing market in 2020 from realtor.com:

- A relatively stagnant market with 1.8% fewer sales of existing homes.
- A national median price increase of only 0.8%.
- 25 of 100 top US cities will experience a drop in average home prices.
- Millennials will account for over 50% of home purchases for the first time ever.
- GenXers will follow with 38% of purchases, trailed by Boomers at 17%.
- Mortgage rates will remain steady peaking at 3.85%.
